We did not receive any nominations for the guild awards this year, but we are aiming for a nomination next year





The University is trying to bring in Online Elections held on a certain date, SCOGUI was one of two societies to still use a paper ballot. The reason for this is cited as making it easier for the societies officer to input the data, and get all the committee with the correct positions.

The reason we gave was because we needed to tie our elections in with the SSAGO elections (we have it in our constitution that we need to have our elections after the SSAGO ones – this is to avoid clashes of committees with people on national and as representatives in their own club committees.) We suspect that they will continue to encourage us to go online. It is felt that this should not be an issue as long as we can set the dates. For simplicity we may have to revert to a paper ballot to ensure our constitution is met. A consultation and vote on the future of this will be proposed at the SGM in October.

2. Tuesday Activities

Of course this term we have continued to undertake Tuesday Activities aiming to make them as varied as possible to attract and retain members. Some of the highlights of this period have been:

- Ant's Aqueducts: Challenge to make aqueducts out of newspaper and sticky tape, this had very good results.
- Ready Steady Cook : All of the random food was brought by members and then we divided into two teams to cook a selection of random culinary delights: Melon and bacon; cockles, noodles, day lily, bacon and tomato ragout; melon, biscuit and condensed milk castles.
- Vegetable Musical Instruments: every had a go at making a trombone out of a carrot, and a bell pepper. The trick is you need a brass player to produce a rather good tune.
- Axes and skills night: A couple of local explorers came to a Tuesday night and ran a skills night for the club to show the safe care and use of the SCOGUI fire making equipment.

There are many other nights but this has been just a small selection of the highlights of the term.

A full incident report was submitted to the Students Union and to the SSAGO Secretary. Following on from this the member has made a good recovery and has finished all his hospital appointments. No further action required.

3. Special Events

Since November we have run Night hike ; Christmas dinner; camping barn; program selling and festival clean up.

- Night Hike: This was run at Sutton Bonnington (on the 5th – 6th March) for all the Loughborough scouts and guides. We had 45 participants and 45 leaders and organisers. The event went well and there no incidents. It has been decided where the next night hike will be run and a person has been identified to supervise the next Night Hike. They were involved in the organisation of this one.

- Christmas dinner: a smaller event than usual held at Goodlifes in Loughborough Town Centre. It was good and enjoyed by all.

- Camping barn: 4 members went to Camping Barn on the 13th – 15th May 2016, held at John's Lee Wood Campsite. It was a relaxing Camp, completed with lots of work on skills and of course a hike. We had a good fire and enjoyed many a game.

- Program selling: We have attended a number of events – Historic Cars, Superbikes, Cholmondeley Power and Speed, and British Touring Cars (Donnington) where we have sold programmes. Depending on availability of the driver we have either driven or taken the bus. We have a number of other programme sellings planned – F1 at Silverstone, Game Fair at Ragley Hall and Moto GP (Donnington)

Paperwork has been lax regarding the stuff needed for the Union and this has been addressed. The Vice Chair has been given guidance and since she has gone home for Summer, responsibilities have been handed over to Laura Mallinson.

- Download Festival clean up- we got stuff!!!!!! 6 members went to help Ethical Festival to salvage kit from Download Festival. This year we went to get kit for local groups and not much for SCOGUI as we have plenty of kit now. Kit will be sent to the Loughborough Town Explorers, and group of Fire Cadets and 10th (Baxtergate) Loughborough Guides.

4. Other Stuff

- Union Constitution: SCOGUI went through and made a number of grammatical and spelling changes to it. This was appreciated and it was voted through at the Societies AGM.

- Container – we have a container!!!!!! Will replace garage storage. Its blue. Dodgy foundations?

Space has been found behind the Union for SCOGUI to have a shipping Container. This was confirmed at the beginning of May. Discussion was then raised to sort out a base for it and ensure the site was suitable. The container was ordered on 1st June. It arrived on site at 16:20 on the 15th June. It cost £2256. This is partially funded (£1000) by the students Union. SCOGUI have paid the rest. SCOGUI will be sorting out the movement of kit and shelving in September the week before term starts. We also intend to Sign Write it in September.

- Membership nos. : We currently have around 15 members who turn up regularly but we are losing a number this year hence our publicity campaign needs to be particularly active this year.

- STASH- pain in the proverbial to sort, got it now. Committee stash is pink! It was suggested that the person on the other end of our go outdoors e-mails needs to be creatively dispacped due to the fact that 108 e-mails were sent to him before we got an answer. The palava regarding stash continued as the place where the stash was being printed was filled with propane gas by the workshop next door, hence we had to wait for this to be vented before the t-shirts could be finished.
